NSW STATE CHAMPIONSHIP 2021 HOSTED BY MUDGEE SPORTING CLAYS

After false starts due to the covid pandemic NSW eventually got to hold a state championship which was held on the Windamere range Mudgee over the weekend of November 13 & 14. Two layouts each consisting of 25 targets had been set by our club for the enjoyment of all participants. All entrants were checked for double vaccination as per NSW health rules. 108 shooters from across NSW and Victoria had nominated for the 200 target challenge. Peter Kay the NSW Clay target director checked the range each morning before shooting commenced. On Saturday morning shooters had to compete in atrocious weather conditions, raining all day with varying wind gusts.

The conditions did not deter either Adam Shale (93/100) or Robert Hall (91/100) though, who would be out in front all weekend. Sunday morning the squads were on the shooting ground bright and early starting off at about 8.30am. Weather had improved from the previous day slightly.

Sunday's scores would reveal a shoot off for the high gun between Robert Hall and Adam Shale who had both shot 179/200. Robert went on to win the shoot off.

The only other shoot off was between Chris Barrowman and Josh Bell for A Grade. Chris went on the win that grade. Results are as follows-

The day was overcast and mild with little or no breeze and conditions were very good for shooting clay targets. Organisers were very happy with the attendance of nearly 30 shooters, including good representation from the Milparinka Club.

The range was set by Brian, Mal, Richard, Tim, Gary, Coxy and Clay who did an excellent job to present a very good variety of targets in a compact range of five stations. The targets didn't look all that hard but, given that the scores were a bit below average, were probably more difficult than they looked. They still made for very enjoyable shooting and the best shooters recorded some good totals.

The best score off the gun was a very good total of 62 that was shot by Clay Johnston. Clay shot consistently all day and was a deserving winner of the High Gun Medal and first place in A Grade. Milparinka shooters won the remaining grades, Rowan Young shot 49 for first place in B Grade, and Rod

Grenfell shot an excellent 51 to easily win C Grade. Tom Casey continued a good run of first place finishes in the Junior Grade with a very good score of 48. With the heavy traffic of large trucks and plenty of rain our internal road has suffered and needs some tender loving care.


Christmas will soon be upon us and we wish all SCA members a Merry Christmas and a happy New Year.

2021 WA SPORTING STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

It has been a tremendous year for WA Shooters; with Covid-19 still dwindling in the background, it has been great to see our sport regain some normality across the State and everyone getting back to what they enjoy. The battle for the State Aggregate Crown began back in March with Harvey Sporting Clays Club being the first to host one of the six State Qualifying events. Open to all SCA members, shooters had to compete in at least 4 of the State Qualifying events and the 2-day State Championship event to be eligible for the State Aggregate leaderboard. These scores also determine the States' Top 10 and the State Team. Qualifying events to follow were held throughout the year at Hastings, Three Springs, Echidna Park, Wanneroo and Moora.

With a record-breaking start to the cropping season, wildflowers in full bloom and a bunch of eager shooters, Echidna Park SC was excited to present the 2021 State Championships at a "never before seen" level for WA Sporting. Held in conjunction with the historical Echidna Park Open, 200 targets were shot over a massive 8 grounds over two days. Being the first time a competition of this scale has been held in WA, preparations began early with the purchase of 15 new promatic traps, planning ground layouts and of course, the setup ready to host the biggest competition on the WA Sporting calendar.

Expectations did not disappoint with a massive 102 shooters competing over the September weekend. We saw a great turnout of campers enjoy the getaway, not to mention the unbelievable meals served up by the Echidna Park club members with 110 Surf 'n' Turfs served on Saturday night for everyone to enjoy.

Blissful conditions saw high class shooting on display with Eli Lahoud (Perth Metro), Angus Grant (Echidna Park) and Mitch McCashney (Echidna Park) receiving 25 Break badges for the weekend.

Congratulations to Paul McGowan (Three Springs) who upped the antics and took home a very impressive 50 break badge, only seen a few times in WA Sporting history. Even with the strong competition, the overall High Gun for the weekend went to Ben Sgro (Pegasus) shooting consistently over every ground to land a total of 179/200, one target ahead of Paul McGowan.

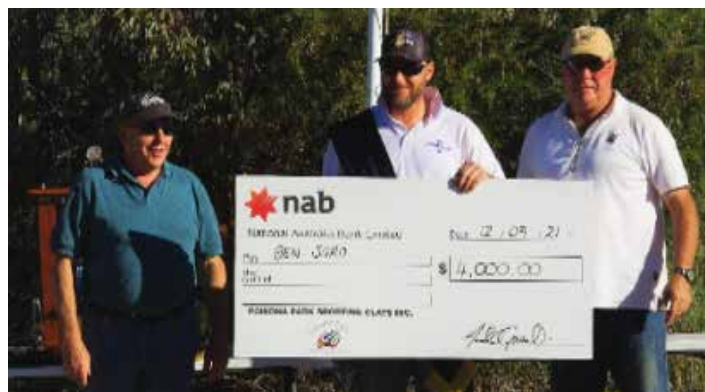

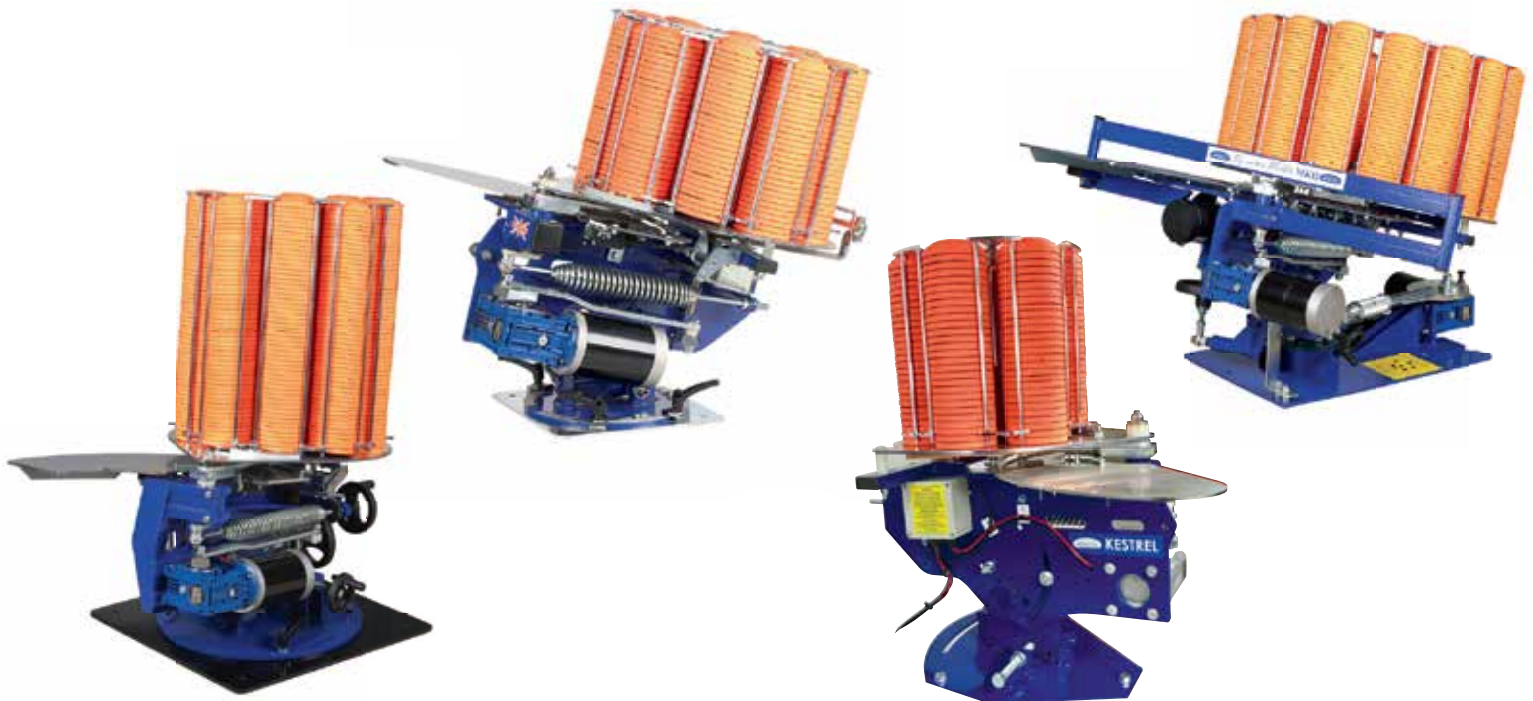

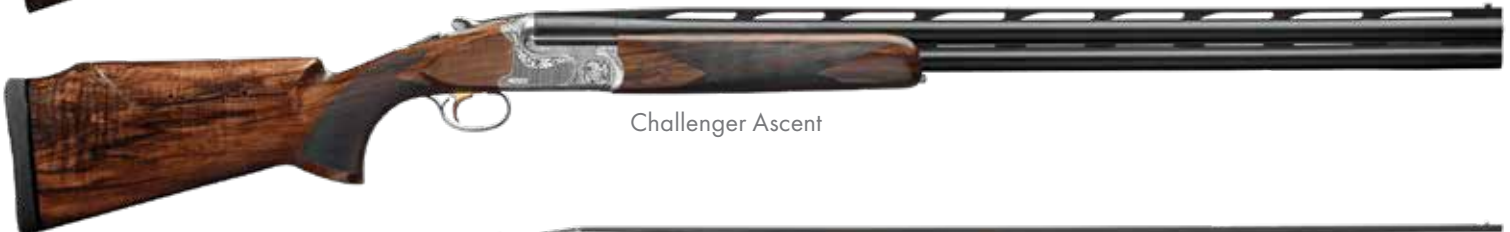
