FROM THE PRESIDENT

Several of our member states have held their AGMs for 2022 and I would like to thank all those involved in administering our activities. I encourage anyone who has a passion for clay target competition or hunting to get involved with their local SCA branch. By now the Australian Grand Prix will have been held at Geelong. The club has completed a great deal of work prior to the event with a lot of clean fill being brought in to improve the shooting ground. The South Australian and Tasmanian duck seasons get underway in March & April respectively. At the time of writing Victoria's season was yet to be declared. I hope that everyone has a safe and successful season and enjoys some time away this year with family and friends. For those of you who may be interested in hunting opportunities in states where they may be limited, contact one of the above states secretaries and ask for some information on opportunities for traveling hunters.

Finally I must make comment on an issue that causes me great concern and that is rumors. Rumors can often start harmless enough but end in people's emotions or reputations being irreversibly damaged. The same can happen to associations and committees. Recently, there have been some rumors that the National Executive (particularly those from Victoria) were looking to fund the Australian team with \$100,000. This is completely untrue! Funding for the Australian team, like many other matters SCA deals with, is set by the board. At the December general meeting a motion was moved and passed that set team funding at \$2750 per team member and official. That is a total of \$55,000. This funding comes from SCA's consolidated revenue and consists in part of membership capitulations and profit from national events. On occasion, private individuals have provided additional funding for the Australian team. I hope this explains how team funding is determined and puts to bed this unsubstantiated nonsense.

COMPETITION NEWS & UPDATES

Category or Grade at Australian Domestic Events and Masters Category

Where a competitor may be eligible to compete in either a grade or category, they must choose one or the other. This is to be done at their first SCA event of the year. This selection must then be retained for the rest of the year.

For the purpose of international selection, all competitors will be placed in their category ie:-

MAN, LADIES, SENIOR, VETERAN, MASTER or JUNIORS

To clarify the understanding of this category the definition has been rewritten as shown

MASTER Category: Open to all shooters from 1st Jan in the year they reach their 73rd birthday.

Our rules will be updated on the web site with these changes shortly.

WA Nationals

With the ability to travel to Western Australia still uncertain as of February, Sporting Clays Australia will not make a final decision regarding the location of the 2022 Nationals until May 2022. Anyone planning to travel to WA and considering making bookings, should ensure they have flexibility in their bookings in case a change of venue or cancellation is required. SCA's ability to conduct events in any state, relies upon the relevant state government covid rules applicable at the time. National Selection process

Release triggers

After a request to review the use of release triggers on SCA ranges/grounds the State Targets Shooting Directors have decided that the status quo is to remain i.e. release triggers are not to be used on SCA ranges/grounds.

National Selection 2022

For the 2022 Year only, a qualifying shooter's results at the Grand Prix and Oceania will be used to select the Australian Team. This may be subject to further change if the Covid situation changes.

On Sunday 5 December the Broken Hill Field and Game Association concluded another Covid effected and shortened annual program of clay target shooting with our ever popular Christmas Shoot. The weather was warm and clear, with a light breeze, and conditions were perfect for shooting clay targets. Organisers were very pleased with a very good turnout of 28 shooters.

The range was set by Josh, Gerard, Richard, Coxy, Tim and Bob, who provided an excellent variety of targets that were only just as difficult as they needed to be at a Christmas shoot. The range comprised four stations and was shot twice to make up the 60 target competition. The best shooters in each grade shot some very good totals.

The High Gun trophy was won by local champion Darryn Nicholls after a shootoff with John Dougherty from Geelong, both shooters finished with a score of 50. Darryn got an early lead in the shootoff and hung on to win the High Gun medal.

John won first place in A Grade, Adrian Locke shot an excellent 49 to finish a very easy winner in B Grade, and Milparinka regular Rodney Grenfell shot 43 for a narrow win in C Grade. Callan Lawrence shot a good 35 to win the Junior Grade.

At the conclusion of shooting the Association's President Rodney Weaver thanked all present for their attendance and support. Rodney then presented prizes to the lucky shoot winners, and also presented the Association's annual awards.

The winner of the Rex and Sidney Carroll Club Championship Cup for 2021 is

Clay Johnston. Clay and Gerard Mahoney were our two best shooters all year and Clay snuck ahead at the finish to win his fourth club championship. He finished the year with 21 points, just a single point clear of Gerard with 20 points, and Brian Casey finished in third place with 14 points.

Perpetual trophies were also awarded to the most successful shooters for 2021 in each Grade. The trophies were presented to Gerard Mahoney (A Grade), Anthony Elliott (B Grade), and Peter Hoare (C Grade). Tom Casey was the winner of the best Junior shooter, and he received the perpetual shield donated by the Rawson family. Cassie McEvoy was our best Lady shooter.

Rod also presented the President's Shield that is awarded to a member who makes an outstanding contribution to the Association during the year. For 2021 the Shield was presented to Richard Murphy. Richard first won this award in 1988, and 2021 was the eleventh time that his name has been engraved on the shield. This represents at least 33 years of invaluable service to the Association, and it doesn't look like finishing any time soon.

The President and members of the Field and Game Association take this opportunity to thank our many sponsors and supporters for the valuable assistance they have given us during 2021. VSCA UPDATE

Aussie Junior Star makes Hall of Fame

Shepparton's Xavier Russell has been inducted to the junior honour roll of the Shepparton Sports Hall of Fame. Xavier started his career at age 14 shooting with his Grandfather and represented Australia at the World FITASC in 2019 in England. 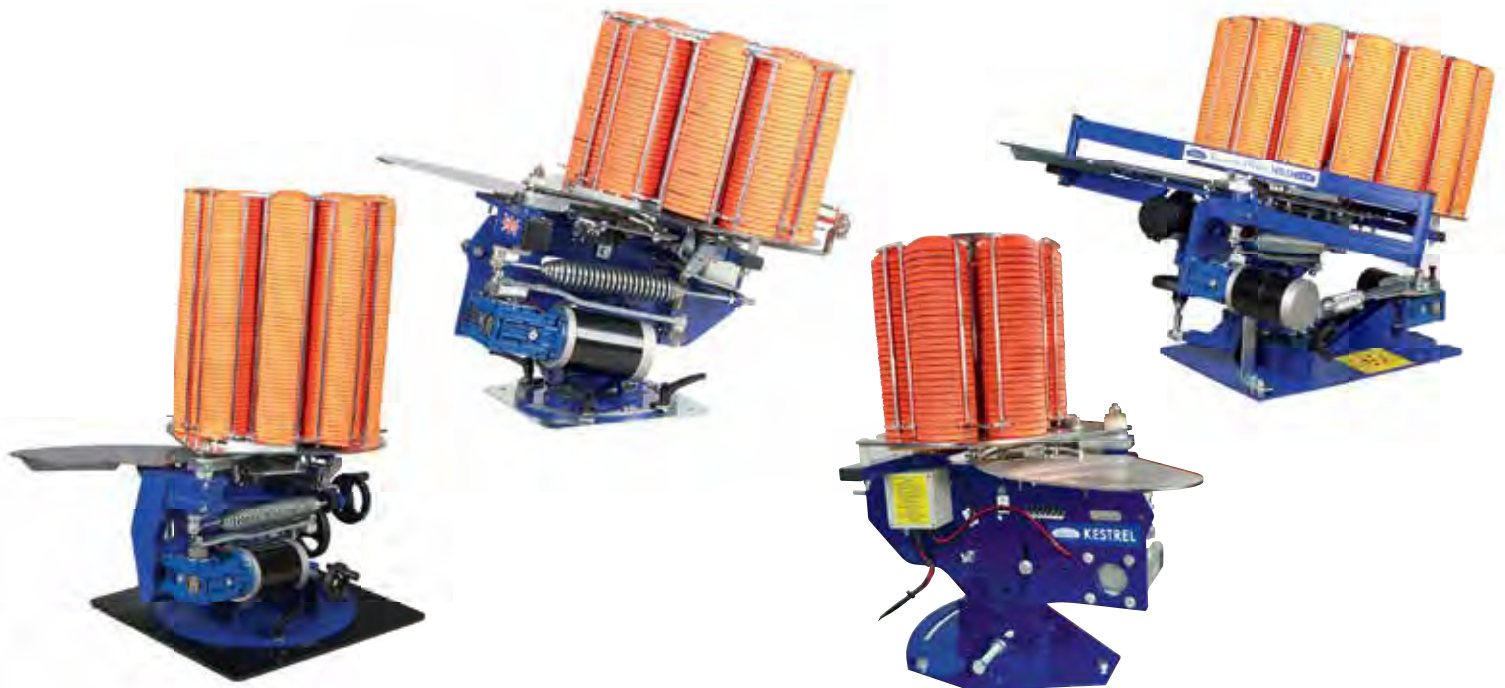

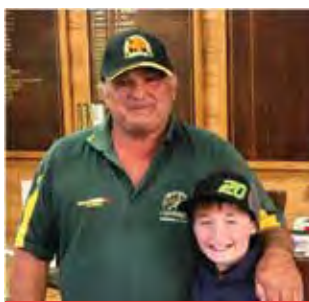
SEFGA CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS 2021

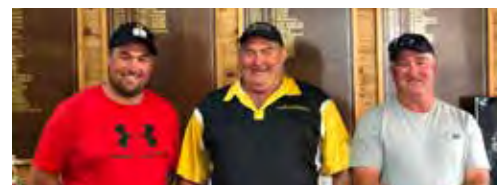

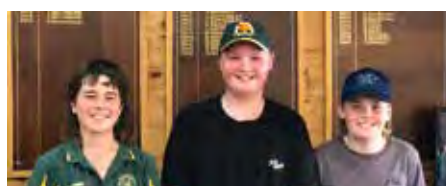

C grade was won by Mick Glen, second was Trevor Whitehead and third going to Neville Jackson.

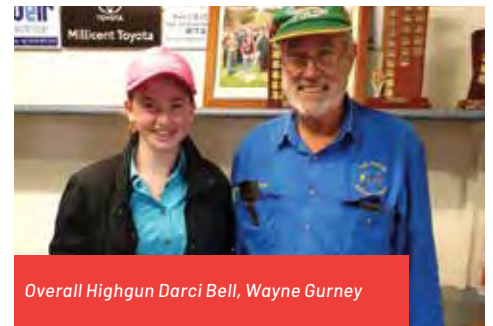

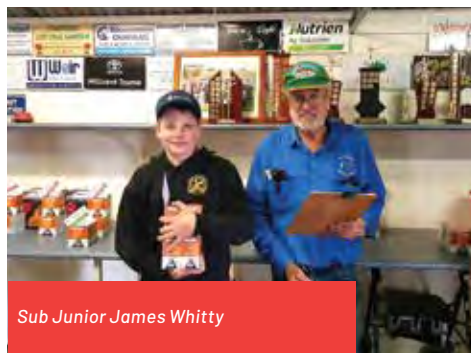

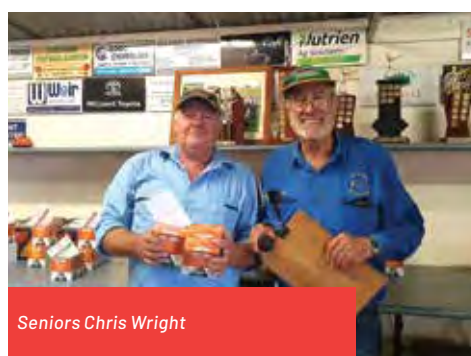
