BROKEN HILL FIELD AND GAME NEWS

38TH ANNUAL 150 TARGET SILVER CITY CHAMPIONSHIPS

By "Shellshocked"

On 8 and 9 October the Broken Hill Field and Game Association, after a two year Covid 19 lockdown, once again hosted its premier simulated field clay target shoot for the year, the thirty eighth annual 150 target Silver City Championships. The weather over the weekend was mostly mild to warm, and sunny, with a breeze that was just strong enough to keep the flies from hanging on. Very good conditions for shooting clay targets. Organisers were delighted with an excellent turnout of 75 shooters from across New South Wales, Victoria and South Australia, particularly from Sunraysia and the Riverland, who competed for an impressive range of sashes and trophies.

Range marshal Josh Edgecumbe, with the assistance of a cast of thousands, and Will from Sunraysia, worked very hard to set an excellent range layout that provided plenty of variety and interest and fun for the shooters. The degree of difficulty of the targets was on the friendly side of average which made for very enjoyable shooting and drew many compliments from the shooters. A job very well done.

The best overall score for the shoot was an excellent total of 135 recorded by AA Grade shooter Brad Harris from the Sunraysia club who won the Silver City Shield High Gun sash with just a single shot up his sleeve at the finish. Brad shot very consistently over the whole weekend to claim a clean sweep of the first place prizes in all three individual championships.

The AA Grade sash was won by Brian McGaffin, also from Sunraysia, who shot 134 and was looking for that extra shot or two all weekend, but you never seem to be able to find them when you need them most.

Loxton shooter Brad Gillespie had a very successful weekend in Broken Hill. He shot an excellent score of 132 to win the A Grade sash by a very comfortable margin, and he finished in first place in both of the graded events on the program. Local shooter Travis Casey was second overall in A Grade, and managed first place in the 50 Target Handicap shoot on Sunday.

Local shooter Adrian Locke also had a great weekend. He shot very well and very consistently for an excellent score of 123 to win the B Grade sash and take a clean sweep of the graded events. Rowan Murphy travelled up from Swan Hill and was rewarded with first place in the 50 target handicap event with a score of 58.

Broken Hill shooters shared all the first place prizes in C Grade. Gary Meehan shot a very good score of 111 to win the first place sash over 150 targets, and he also won the 100 target graded event on Saturday. Hayden Beven finished with 109 for second place overall and won first place in the 50 target handicap event with a score of 63.

Loxton shooter Julie Gillespie has been a regular competitor at the Silver City Championships. This year Julie was easily the best of the lady shooters taking a comfortable first place in the 150 target event, and winning the Ladies sash, with a great score of 113. Julie also won the 100 target graded event on Saturday. Karen Miller from the Renmark club shot an excellent score of 61 on Sunday to win the 50 target handicap event

Brian Casey is one of Broken Hill's more successful shooters with good wins this year at home and away. Brian continued his good form with excellent shooting to win both the 150 target and 100 target graded events with a great score of 130 and he was an easy winner of the Senior sash. Tony McGauchie from the Renmark club shot an excellent score of 61 on Sunday to win the 50 target handicap event

The Junior Grade was dominated by Dylan Boseley from the Sunraysia club who shot extremely well for a total of 129, fifth place off the gun for the shoot, and he won the Junior sash by a very comfortable margin. Dylan also won first place in the 100 target event on Saturday. Broken Hill junior Lincoln Casey shot a very good 62 on Sunday to win the 50 target handicap event.

The Claypan Penguins Handicap Team Championship was won by the Broken Hill team, "Team Casey". Family members Brian Casey, Travis Casey, Tom Casey and Lincoln Casey all shot extremely well to score 661 on handicap which was easily good enough for the championship win. Another Broken Hill team "Mullet & Co." finished in second place with 653, and the Riverland/Sunraysia team "Rat Pack" took third place with 650.

The day was warm and sticky with little or no breeze and despite shooters having to acclimatise for the first hot day of the year conditions were pretty good for shooting clay targets. Organisers were very happy with the attendance of 28 shooters.

The best score off the gun was an excellent total of 67 that was shot by Brian Casey who has been the club's best and most consistent shooter all year. Brian was a deserving winner of the High Gun Medal, first place in A Grade, and the Ian West Memorial Trophy.

The result in B Grade was very tight indeed. Tim Millstead shot 62 for the first place prize and he was closely followed by no fewer than five shooters who all finished with a score of 60. Gary Meehan was a comfortable winner in C Grade with a good score of 57.

SPORTING CLAYS NSW - TRAINING CAMP SUCCESS

In June of this year, I (Sporting Clays NSW Team Manager) took several juniors and ladies to the National Ladies and Junior Training Camp held at Geelong Sporting Clays each year.

From that weekend an idea was born. A month later I pitched the idea to the NSW committee to hold an event specifically targeted at B & C Grade shooters as well as ladies and juniors. After a few suggestions were thrown around and a couple of phone calls made, a host club (Mudgee Sporting Clays) was secured. In fact the Mudgee committee did not hesitate to accept the request when asked if they would be interested in hosting the event and enthusiastically put the wheels in motion. The weekend of 19 & 20 November was set and what started as an ambitious idea, quickly gained momentum and was shaping to become a great weekend.

Sporting Clays NSW had not hosted a formal training/coaching weekend for its members for many years. The running of this event was intended to be a trial to gauge the interest with a view of potentially holding more in the future. Eleven phone calls were made to current and former NSW state team representatives, and within a few hours we had ourselves a training camp in the making with ten of the eleven people contacted available and willing to pass their skills and experience onto those wanting to attend the training camp. The next step was to develop a format for each day and after some discussion with a few of the trainers a planned format was created. I also made contact with former Australian Ladies Olympic Trap shooter and SSAA National Coaching and Membership Development Manager, Gemma Dunn. A casual Sporting Clays shooter and local icon of shooting sports Gemma was contacted to enquire how we could secure her services for the weekend. Before I knew it a partnership between SC NSW and SSAA was formed and the planning was taking shape.

After a couple of emails to NSW Sporting Clays clubs, posts on club and Home of Sporting Clays Facebook pages, and flyers advertised at several club shoots leading up to November, participants were invited to attend a full days training which consisted of:

- **Welcome and Introductions**
- **Presentation - Shooting Fundamentals** - Mastering the Basics (refer to SSAA magazine - The Australian Junior Shooter (issue 27))
- **Presentation - Eye Dominance**
- **Morning training session** - Practical shooting with trainers
- **BBQ Lunch**
- **Presentation** - Dealing with pressure
- **Afternoon training session** - Practical shooting with trainers
- **Presentation** - Chokes and Ammunition
- **Question and Answer session**

After 1 day of advertising, 18 interested shooters were booked in and it became clear very quickly that less experienced shooters were looking for training to improve their shooting.

Once nominations had closed, we had 42 shooters locked in to attend of which some travelled from as far away as Narooma and Cooma in the south, Orange, Dubbo and Warren in the west and from Sydney and the Central Coast.

Fast forward about 6 weeks and the training camp was on. Several groups of participants arrived at the Mudgee grounds on Friday afternoon ready for the day that followed. The weather was looking like being a perfect 23 - 27 degrees and sunny both days and despite Sunday being windy, it didn't impact on the enthusiasm of the trainers or participants.

Despite a few cancellations due to work and family commitments and illness in the week leading up to and on the weekend of the event, 23 participants attended on Saturday.

Myself and Gemma and our team of helpers were at it bright and





early Saturday morning putting the final touches on things, setting up a display area, and preparing for the morning presentations that were planned. After a quick brief with the trainers about the format of the day, the need for heightened safety awareness, and the areas we wanted the trainers to focus their attentions on (e.g. having a plan, sticking to the process, feet position, gun hold and focal points, and the various methods of acquiring a Sporting Clays Target), participants started to roll up. After welcoming the shooters to the SSAA Windemere Regional Shooting Complex the first of the two training camps was underway.

The group started very enthusiastically listening to Gemma deliver her two presentations and by the time we split into groups and headed out to the range for the morning session of shooting, you could feel the positive vibe amongst the participants and trainers..... it was shaping to be a great day.

After 2.5hrs of shooting, the shooters returned for a well earned BBQ lunch. With Beef or Chicken hamburgers, sausages and salad on offer, the ladies in the kitchen really turned the tucker on, with many rounding lunch out with some Rocky Road to keep the energy levels up.

After a midday presentation on dealing with pressure to give the participants a break from shooting they headed back out to the two ranges that had been set for the afternoon session of shooting with their trainers.

By the time 3:30pm came around, there were plenty of tired and weary shooters and trainers so we started to wind the day down with a presentation by Peter Kay, NSW Clay Target Director on chokes and ammunition which generated a lot of group discussion.

With the afternoon sun fast approaching new shooters attending Sundays training day started to arrive at the club. As they were setting up their camp sites we rounded the Saturday training camp out with a question and answer session that was created by the participants and trainers throwing questions in a box throughout the day which were either specific to a person, directed at all the trainers or asked anonymously. We made it a fun session with plenty of serious discussion and a fair few laughs with some banter thrown in along the way as we ended the day with a big thanks to all of the participants for their attendance, and the trainers for giving up their time. As most of the participants headed home, some stayed and enjoyed the night camping at the club. The night was consumed by a few quiet drinks and plenty of discussion about what had been learnt throughout the day before heading home the following morning.

After plenty of thunder and lightning and a fair amount of rain in the wee hours overnight, the sun rose on Sunday to clear skies and a howling westerly. 14 participants attended. One couple (Anthony and Alana) from the previous day even came back on Sunday for a half day of shooting to reinforce their learning from the day before, whilst a third person (Peter) stayed for the whole day after attending Saturday. Several people commented that they would have loved to come back with a couple heading home to shoot their club shoot and reinforce their learning.

The new group in attendance on Sunday started just enthusiastically (albeit a bit shy and a fair bit quieter to start with) but with a smaller group of 14 in attendance we were able to modify the day a little from what we had learnt from the first session the day before.

The day ran in the same format as the first day of the training camp but with only 2 participants per trainer, and some 1:1 coaching for some, there was no shortage of shooting time available to

the participants. So much so we reduced the shooting time so everyone could get away and return home at a decent hour.

As the sun was falling fast from the sky on Sunday arvo, there was no doubt everyone who had attended or played a part in this two day training camp had witnessed something exciting for Sporting Clays NSW. The weekend was a great success with feedback from participants, trainers and Mudgee Sporting Clays club members who helped with the running of the weekend overwhelmingly positive. We were all feeling very proud of what we had created and how it had been delivered.

None of this however would have been possible without the willingness of the Mudgee Sporting Clays executive committee who agreed to host the weekend and assisted with the preparation. Gemma Dunn (SSAA) for her presentations and assistance with training the girls and of course our very talented and willing current and former state team members who gave up their weekends to pass on their knowledge and experience to other shooters.

An unintended consequence of the weekend was that the running of the event also generated two new lady members and one renewed membership. Attracting new members and developing the skills of existing members is critical to the longevity and future of our sport.

With a new Coaching Director (Doug Alcott) voted in at the recent Sporting Clays NSW AGM, we are considering making this a calendared event each year with the option of running additional smaller days at clubs where the need arises. One thing that is for sure.....good things are happening at Sporting Clays NSW. With a focus on developing the ladies, juniors and less experienced shooters within our state set to continue, 2023 is looking very exciting.



SCWA MEMBERSHIP INCREASE 20.4% FOR 2022

Our membership numbers have increased for 2022 with the biggest growth at Perth Metro and Hastings clubs. Our female memberships have also increased in numbers from last year. From a recent survey by SCWA we know that most shooters are in the sport for enjoyment and comradery and will travel to club events and 1/3 of our members are into competition shooting and will support all clubs who hold competition events. These numbers are increasing. We need to cater for everyone and getting more people into our shooting sport is fantastic to see. I need to thank all the clubs for conducting come and try days, special events to encourage more juniors and females, corporate events, and coaching, this has all collectively contributed to our membership increase. Receiving capitation fees goes a long way to helping our member clubs out with Directors liability insurance, funding policy and prizes for all State events and our state teams.

NUMBERS INCREASING FOR STATE QUALIFIERS AND STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS.

It is extremely pleasing to note that this year saw a continuing trend with our numbers increasing for our state-run qualifiers and state championships. To have this increase during another covid year is remarkable and with only 4 State Qualifiers being held as opposed to 6 in the previous year. We had 158 individual members compete throughout the year and this is up from 126 from last year, which is an increase of 25.3%.

At each State Qualifier we are getting nearly 100 shooters attend compared to 5 years ago whereby we were lucky to get 50 shooters attend. Our State Target Director Ryan McPherson with Clayton Dennis have put in a huge amount of time and effort over the past few years. We can't thank them enough, along with their supportive families for their dedication to the sport and mentoring other course setters. It will be sad to say farewell as they hand the reins over to another State Target Director for 2023. Clayton even travelled to Italy during the year on a fact-finding mission on how to throw more interesting targets at the SCA Nationals hosted by Echidna Park.

NEW MEMBER CLUB COME ON BOARD – WEST AUSTRALIAN GUN CLUB

In June, our Board voted in our newest member club. The West Australian Gun Club which is an ACTA ground situated at the Whiteman Park International Shooting complex became our 8th club here in WA. The ground caters for ISSF, Trap, Skeet, 5 Stand Sporting and FITASC Universal Trench and now Sporting Clays and Compak. The ACTA told the WA Gun club that if they want to run Universal Trench events then they need to affiliate with SCA. This came as great news for our sport. Whilst there is a smaller ground

that is part of Perth Metro Sporting Clays situated at the same complex the Board were satisfied that this new club will not impact greatly upon Perth Metro as they have 2 grounds and it now allows all our SCA members to attend practice sessions and compete at WA Gun Club with Sporting Clays, Compak and Universal Trench. The WA Gun Club have put together membership categories which allows all SCA members to attend designated events.

It is a pleasure to welcome WA Gun Club on board as our 8th Member Club and we look forward to holding many events at this ground which is situated in the metropolitan area and open 5 days a week.

Since SCWA could not find a club to host the 2022 State Compak Championships it was decided to offer it to the newest club. It was a collaborative effort between State and WAGC to run this event at WAGC and it was a huge success with 61 shooters attending, this was the highest number of shooters to take part in a State Compak for a very long time. We welcome WA Gun Club on board and thank Nick Melanko and Jay Waterhouse for organising a great event and welcoming all the SCA members to these magnificent grounds.

We are looking forward to what the 2023 season brings for our Association. Hopefully, we can continue the trend with increased memberships and cater for more coaching for members, increased referee numbers and encouraging our members to attend more state events. The Board is fully aware of the rising costs for members and clubs with the price of targets increasing. There will be no increase in the State capitations for 2023 and we are looking at incentives to assist clubs to hold state events and make it worthwhile for Clubs to hold a state event. Clubs can be assured that there will be more dollars back to the clubs who hold state events. We certainly need more members to take part because without the members support, we have no state competitions.


