




Your Board and Executive going forward will be working through the states to get a draft Constitution out to you all to bring this Organisation into the modern era and be reflective of new laws and our current environment.

21ST AUSTRALIAN FITASC GRAND PRIX

The last Grand Prix to be held at the Laang range was back in 2021 for again the FITASC SCA Australian Grand Prix event. As always Steve Chilton & the Laang Team showed again why they are the premiere shooting ground in Victoria & one of the best in Australia without question!

When nominations opened the entries started to flood in & as per SCA expectations it was another sell out SCA Competition at Laang, with the maximum numbers & with members on the waiting list. SCA did post several times to members not to delay getting their nominations in. A few may have considered this a ruse to get members on seats, but we do not play these games & a few missed out on what was one of the best events for a few years in Australia. Prior to Covid many SCA National Events reached maximum numbers & it would appear we are back into this cycle. A lesson to be learnt for the remaining National Competitions this year, you must get in early these days to secure your spot!!

The weather held good for the two days of Competition & Saturday started off looking threatening with rain, although it did not eventuate & held off giving perfect overcast conditions for shooting. Sunday opened with an overcast sky. The low ground down in the valley was a little cool & misty for the first of the mark squads at 8:15 for the kick off. Anyone with a Smokey cartridge certainly found out in the trees as the cloud hung in the air with no wind, making the short looper a test.

The course of targets set up for each day consisted of 4 grounds of 25 targets with 4 stations to each. You shot two grounds of 25 target layouts for a rotation (50 targets straight through for each visit), with two rotations each day to make up the 100 targets. Each layout of 25 targets was set up with 4 stands throwing 6 + 6 + 7 + 6 targets off each (not necessarily in that order) to make up 25 targets per round in singles and doubles as per the FITASC regulations with menus all reading correctly & marked up for the exotic Clays. To clarify a question that was raised, sorry a Chondel standard is not classed as an exotic Clay if it is a standard 110mm Clay. It is not how target is thrown that classifies it as an "Exotic" it is the diameter of the clay (60mm/70mm/90mm) or whether it is a Rabbit or battue Clay. These Clays other than a 110mm mark them as "Exotic" & these must

be mentioned on the Menus in the singles (Not necessarily in the Doubles once they are mentioned in the single menu).

The Laang Club has a well-deserved reputation for putting on courses that everyone can enjoy, no matter what your skill level and Steve Chilton with assistance from his crew did not disappoint this weekend with the target presentations which had the grades hitting the correct percentages. A great variety of Targets both in presentation & options of exotics. Every angle, trajectory & speed was taken care of. Even the Moorhen target on the First Station was the first for many, especially launched off an automatic trap. One of the new traps out from Promatic & available in Australia. I believe Laang would be the first Club to purchase this new trap in Australia.

It was a great result to see the Event Partners to SCA coming back on Board after the Covid Shutdown. Many companies suffered greatly when the whole of Australia went into melt down shutting everything down & its taken some time to get back up to speed. SCA would like to thank OTC (GB/Promatic) - Perazzi - Beretta - Castellani for supporting this event.

After the first 100 targets Nick Guerra led the pack with a 94/100. Closely followed by Gavin Dyson 93/100 - Grant Sandford. Jack Gibbs, Robert Hall, Colin Johns, Leight Dunn on 92/100. Very tight at the top with it left open for anyone come day two. Colin Johns was in the Senior category & led the field there on 92/100 - Eddie Magee & Ronnie Rook led Veterans on 86/100 - Ladies was led by Renae Birgan 87/100, Bianca Norris 86/100 & Emalene Munro 78/100 - In the Masters Division John Torresan was ahead with 79/100 then Ken Triffet 78/100 & Warwick Cumberland 77/100, In Juniors Ben Studham was in the lead 86/100, followed by Charlie North 83/100 & Zayne Papaluca 81/100. The scene was set for a final showdown on the remaining 100 targets to close the event out.

Day two and the final run kicked off at 8:15am for the first two squads. A chilly start and slightly overcast making the target a little dull in the wooded area of the Perazzi/ Castellani Ground. The weather threatened a few times to rain early on in the morning but it held off for the rest of the day's competition & didn't return until the end of the closing ceremony. Good for the undercover presentation area at Laang.

RENEWED FOCUS ON IMPROVING SHOOTING SKILLS IN NSW.



Sporting Clays NSW is set to support new and existing members of all ages with coaching opportunities to improve their scores and most importantly their enjoyment of the sport. Unfortunately, the Covid pandemic slowed down coaching activity somewhat, but prior to this there had been considerable effort put into building coaching capacity through engaging more experienced members in coach training activities. Our former State Coaching director Ken Jones did a sterling job building a base of volunteer coaches in southern NSW through coach training days that sought to build both generic coaching skills and skills more specific to our sport. Ken also put passionate personal effort into helping some of our young up and comers to build their shooting skills.

Last year Ken retired from the State Coaching Director role to concentrate more on one-on-one coaching. Sporting Clays NSW thank him for his valuable contribution to our sport and wish him well.

At the NSW AGM last November, I was asked to step into the coaching role and being the recipient of generous assistance with my own shooting from many experienced over the years, I felt this was a way I could give something back. I have spent most of my career in agricultural education which is possibly one of the most challenging fields of adult education, so I feel I come with solid skills in communicating technical concepts and imparting physical skills. Like many of us I began my shooting journey on the DTL traps in the 80's but over the years I have had success in Trap, Skeet and Sporting clays.

It is our intention this year to commence a program of engaging new club level coaches to improve the capacity of our clubs to help their members to improve their shooting. At the same time, we will also deliver some structured shooter development opportunities similar to the workshops held at Mudgee last year. These will specifically target the lower grades and junior shooters along their pathway to improvement. We will be relying on the SCNSW member clubs to provide facilities to deliver these at multiple locations over a period of time so if you are passionate about the sport and feel you can offer something in a coaching role or you simply have a desire to improve your shooting and feel you would like some coaching to help you on your way, approach your clubs executive and tell them you would like to be involved when the opportunities arise.


BROKEN HILL FIELD AND GAME NEWS BY "SHELLSHOCKED"

Sunraysia shooter Brian McGaffin won AA Grade with a score of 57, just a single target behind first place. Three shooters finished with a score of 55 at the top of the B Grade results and Rowan Young, President of the Milparinka Club, had to wait for a count back to award him the first place prize. Lachlan Day, also from the Milparinka Club, shot a good score of 53 for a comfortable first place in C Grade. Cassie Hibberd shot 45 to win the Ladies trophy, and Tom Casey, our top junior shooter, shot 49 for a very narrow win in the Junior Grade.

At the conclusion of shooting the Association's President Rodney Weaver thanked all present for their attendance and support. Rodney then presented prizes to the lucky shoot winners, and also presented the Association's annual awards.

The winner of the Rex and Sidney Carroll Club Championship Cup for 2022 is Brian Casey. Brian was easily our best and most consistent shooter all year and he finished the year with 33 points, more than double the points scored by the next best shooter. An achievement all the more meritorious given that Brian is one of the clubs growing number of veteran shooters. For 2023 Brian has set an example for all of our other veteran shooters, and a challenge for all of the young blokes.

Perpetual trophies were also awarded to the most successful shooters for 2022 in each Grade. The trophies were presented to Clay Johnston and Travis Casey (A Grade), Jeff Glasson (B Grade),





VALE BRYAN STOKES FAREWELL FROM ROCKY GULLY

On Boxing Day 2022 Rocky Gully lost an outstanding member who made an enormous contribution to our Club. Bryan was someone that once met was never forgotten. Some might have described him as a 'larger than life' character or even a 'force of nature'. At Rocky Gully we would simply say of him that he was a great bloke and he is very sorely missed.

In his time with Rocky Gully and in the sport of Sporting Clays he held a number of positions. At Rocky Gully he was at various times Vice President, President and general committee member as well as a long time sponsor, in conjunction with Garry Tucker, of our English Sporting Xmas shoot. He also played a significant role at the State level of our sport holding the positions of President and Treasurer for many years.

Bryan was a very successful businessman who, to our great fortune, chose to share his time, business skills and financial acumen with our club and the sport we all love. Fortunately, Bryan was, when faced with opposition and criticism, able to look beyond that, especially when supported by those who valued him for his drive and energy. Rocky Gully valued Bryan greatly as he played a key role as part of a small group that changed the direction of our club and ultimately of sporting clays in South Australia. Bryan was instrumental in the modernisation of our state association and his vision and drive helped bring it into the 21st century and gave all SA clubs independence and self-determination to which all SA members should owe a debt of thanks. Without Bryan's determined leadership, that group would not have been able to achieve what it did.

Bryan first came to Rocky Gully Sporting Clays as part of a group invited to the club to participate in the trial run of our Corporate Shooting programme. This venture was greatly supported by some key sponsors, namely Fisher Firearms and Winchester. Sponsors and supporters were invited to a dress rehearsal of the corporate day format and asked to invite, as our guest, one of their customers or friends. Bryan came as the guest of Greg Sparrow, the proprietor of Fisher Firearms. The event was a great success and Bryan had such a good time that he just never left. While Bryan had been a keen shooter in other disciplines he had never before shot sporting clays. All those reading this will no doubt understand just how hard the sporting clays bug can bite.

When Bryan arrived at Rocky Gully we had no idea at all about who Bryan was or what he had achieved in his life as an entrepreneur and businessman, but we soon found out. Perhaps one moment stands out above all else, for many people at Rocky Gully their first time meeting Bryan at the club was when they drove into the club one day for a round of practice, only to see Bryan's helicopter parked in the middle of the grounds, certainly living up to his 'larger than life' presence. The Club provided Bryan with coaching through its coaching programme as he struggled

to master the dark art of sporting clays. The coaches greatly enjoyed their time with Bryan as he was a very keen pupil who picked up the skills of sporting clays quickly and threw himself into the sport, enjoying all the fun and enjoyment it could bring.

A great deal of shooters all across Australia may be familiar with "Australis", Bryan's Kreighoff 'gun of the year' engraved with iconic images of our great country. Most guns like this are locked away somewhere as a collector's piece, never to be used, but Bryan was not one of those people and to his credit he used Australis every time he was shooting. Just to see such a beautiful gun like that in use was something special and it is a testament to the type of generous and friendly person that Bryan was that he was never shy in offering absolutely anybody to 'have a few shots' with the gun.

The list of what Bryan did for Rocky Gully and the sport is long so here are just two of the most important examples: He provided numerous interest free loans for the club, (all of which I'm proud to be able to say we paid back) and he purchased a small parcel of land that abutted the boundary of the club property that enabled much better use to be made of some really great shooting ground. This latter item allowed bigger events to be held by the club. These acts of generosity laid the foundation for what Rocky Gully has become, namely one of the best Sporting Clay venues in Australia. Bryan also had a fascination for heavy equipment which he was able to indulge on the Club property. His projects included a large digger and tip truck. Holes, some of considerable size, and their resulting piles of rock and sand would regularly appear around the ground. Some of these holes and piles were useful and were used by the target setters, others not so much. If you're reading this Bryan, there are still a few holes that you promised to fill that are still waiting.

But what Bryan brought to Rocky Gully, more than anything else was energy, drive and a 'can do' attitude. Many times, when ideas were being discussed about future developments for the sport and other people said 'that's not achievable', Bryan would counter with "why not?" If he saw something that needed doing he just did it or found a way to make it happen. The new practice field at Rocky Gully is one instance; when Bryan put forward the suggestion of the club building such a facility and at the time it seemed to us like a fantasy, an insurmountable task that, while a nice 'wish list' we may never truly see eventuate. However, with Bryan's drive and insistence that such a thing could be achieved, we persevered and many years later it has become a reality. I'm very glad Bryan was able to see his vision come into being, something I know he was very proud of.

At the same time in the club house or when travelling to competitions, he was the life of the party and raised everyone's spirits with his voice, laughter, and sense of humour. We were lucky to have known him and Rocky Gully is the better for having had him as a member. He will be sorely missed by us all.




