HISTORY

The Association started in 1974 under the banner of the "Field and Game Federation of Australia Inc" (FGFA) by the six Australian states. In 1981 the FGFA became affiliated with Federation Internationale de Tir Aux Armes Sportives de Chasse (FITASC), which is the controlling body for International competition in the non-olympic shotgun shooting sports i.e. Parcours de Chasse (FITASC Sporting), Compak Sporting, Helice (ZZ) - Fosse, (Universal Trench) and Combined Game Shooting. In 1982 FGFA sent its first Australian representative team to the world championships in France. Representative teams have competed in FITASC international competition each year since. The FITASC World Championships have been conducted in Australia three times – Geelong 1988, Mt. Gambier 1994 and Warrnambool 2009. Australian teams and individuals have enjoyed much success on the world stage with a number of podium appearances. In November 2015 the Association went through a major restructure and adopted a new name "Sporting Clays Australia Association" (SCA), and a new logo.
